The decedent's animals were taken by SB City animal control. Interview with friend: I spoke with who has known the decedent for 8 years and very familiar with her family dynamics and health problems. She last spoke to the decedent on either Friday or Saturday of last week. The decedent was telling her that she (decedent) was experiencing sharp pains in the area of her gallbladder. Per the decedent would get these pains when he (decedent) was very stressed and they started about 3-4 years ago. The decedent was very anti-hospital, anti-vaccine and paranoid that the pharmaceutical companies were after her. The decedent started a non-profit group called learntherisk org after leaving an executive job at large pharmaceutical company. She believed that the pharma "people" were after her therefore she reinforced the locks to her residence. She would only seek out holistic doctors for any type of medical aliment she was experiencing.

The decedent did not smoke, drank alcohol socially and did not take any prescription medications. She appeared to be possibly suffering some type of undiagnosed mental health diagnosis. did not know the location or phone number to the father of the decedent's child and stated that the child's biological grandparents live in France. She was more than willing to watch the decedent's son and take him to France if needed.



#### Physical Evidence:

Digital Photographs of the decedent were taken and stored at the Santa Barbara Sheriff's Coroner's Bureau. Samples of blood and vitreous humor were collected, one tube of blood was sent to Ascertain Forensics for toxicology screening, the remaining samples are retained at the Coroner's Bureau pending the need for further analysis.

#### Case Review:

The decedent, Brandy Vaughan, died at her home on 12/07/2020. The Santa Barbara Police Department responded to investigate and determined that there were no signs of foul play. After extensive searching, I was unable to locate next of kin for the decedent and turned the case over to the Santa Barbara County Public Administrator's Office to handle issues regarding next of kin and the final disposition of the decedent's body. During the course of this investigation, the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office was contacted by many individuals expressing concern over the death of the decedent, however, no valuable leads were developed from these messages/letters/e-mails.

## Narrative

Narrative:

On 12/07/2020, at 1443 hours, an examination of the decedent was conducted at the Coroner's Bureau. The decedent was received unclothed and supine. A tag with her name printed on it was attached to the body bag.

The decedent was a well-developed, Caucasian female whose appearance was commensurate with her stated age of 44 years. She had a full head of medium length black in color hair. Slight arcus senilis was noted in each of her eyes and she had visible creasing on each earlobe. Her chest was symmetrical. The decedent's abdomen was not distended. Post mortem lividity was on her posterior rigor mortis was present her extremities. No signs of visible or palpable trauma were detected. Samples of subclavian blood was collected. One tube of subclavian blood was submitted to Ascertain Forensics for toxicology analysis. The remaining fluid samples were refrigerated at the Coroner's Bureau pending a need for toxicology analysis.

I reviewed the initial report authored by Senior Deputy Henslin. Due to the decedent's age, and lack of medical history, I requested an autopsy be conducted. The autopsy was performed by Dr. Manny Montez on 12/08/2020 at 1000 hours, with the assistance of Coroner Forensic Technician John Kolbert. Detective John DeLeon was also present during the autopsy due to the fact I was not in attendance. Dr. Montez authored an autopsy report, documenting his findings at autopsy. Please refer to his attached report for more details regarding the autopsy.

I received a copy of Santa Barbara Police Department reports regarding this death, authored under SBPD case number 2020-55739; refer to the aforementioned report for additional information regarding statements and scene observations. The responding officers interviewed several parties. Officer Trevino interviewed the decedent's In summation, the told Officer Trevino he had gone through his normal morning routine on the date of the decedent's death, and had gone outside to retrieve their dogs from the backyard while the decedent stated she was going to the bathroom. When he came back into the home, approximately 20 minutes later, he discovered the decedent on the floor of the bathroom. He stated to the officer that she was murmuring, her eyes were open and it appeared that she was breathing. The decedent's then went to the living room to watch YouTube on his iPad. After approximately an hour, he went back to the bathroom and noticed the decedent was still in the bathroom, in the same position, but she was no longer making any noises. The decedent's explained that his mom did not look "normal" and called the cofficer that the decedent had not been feeling well for a while and said she had pain in her lower stomach area.

On 12/14/2020, Detective Biedinger collected and submitted a nasal pharyngeal swab to Santa Barbara County Public Health, the sample tested negative for the Covid-19 Virus.

Consultation with Forensic Pathologist:

I reviewed this case with Dr. Montez, and discussed his findings at autopsy. During the autopsy he found multiple well-formed thromboemboli in the right and left pulmonary arteries. Dr. Montez opined the cause of death to be Pulmonary Thromboembolus. Please see the attached autopsy report for more information regarding his findings.

Conclusion:

After reviewing the medical documents, the toxicology reports, and the circumstances surrounding the death of Brandy Vaughan, I certified her death as follows:

Cause: Pulmonary Thromboembolus

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A postmortem examination of the body, **VAUGHAN**, **BRANDY**, a 44 year old female, White, is authorized by the sheriff coroner and is performed at 1000 hours, on December 8, 2020, at the Santa Barbara County Sheriff Coroner's Facility in Santa Barbara, California.

Present is Sheriff Coroner Detective John DeLeon. Assisting during the examination is Coroner Forensic Technician John Kolbert.

The body is received in a zipped black plastic body bag and is identified by an appropriately labeled identification tag affixed to the bag. The identification tag is inscribed with the decedent's name and case number. When first viewed, the body is unclad.

### **EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:**

The body is of a well-developed, well-nourished, White female, weighing approximately 155 pounds, measuring approximately 64 inches in length, and appearing the recorded age of 44 years.

The head is symmetric and the brown scalp hair is greater than 12". The eyes have hazel irides and the conjunctivae and sclerae are without petechiae, jaundice, or hemorrhage. The dilated pupils are round and equal. Slight arcus is present. The eyelids are unremarkable. The pierced ears are normally formed. The nasal cartilage and bones are unremarkable upon palpation. The nares are patent and have no discharge. The nasal septum is intact. The lips are unremarkable. The oral cavity has intact teeth and an atraumatic mucosa. The tongue is unremarkable. The face is symmetric and there are no palpable fractures. The neck is unremarkable. The trachea is in the midline. The anterior aspect of the torso is well-developed. The breasts are without palpable masses. The abdomen is not distended. The posterior aspect of the torso is well developed. The genitalia are of a normally developed female without trauma. The empty anus is patent and atraumatic. The extremities are well-developed.



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The fingernails are long and intact. The toenails are short, intact, and painted with pink polish.

There is a tattoo of an Asian symbol over the lower midline back. There is a 1/4" mole over the lateral right buttock. There is a faint irregular scar below the right knee. There is a faint linear scar/heeling abrasion over the front of the upper left thigh. There are two small linear scars over the left knee.

## **POSTMORTEM CHANGES:**

Rigor mortis is full and symmetrical; livor mortis is non-fixed and dorsal; the body is cold to touch. Tach noire is present over the eyes.

## THERAPEUTIC PROCEDURES:

There are cardioversion patches on the chest. There is an intra-osseous fluid catheter in the right lower leg.

#### **INJURIES:**

- A 1/8" faint abrasion over the right elbow.
- A 1/8" old abrasion over the left elbow.

## INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

**HEAD**: The scalp is unremarkable. The subgaleal tissues and temporalis muscles are unremarkable. The skull is without fracture. There is no epidural, subdural, or subarachnoid hemorrhage. The dura and leptomeninges are unremarkable. The brain

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weighs 1260 grams and has normal distributions of cranial nerves and cerebral vessels. There is no significant atherosclerosis. The white and grey matter are normally distributed. The deep nuclei and ventricles are unremarkable. The pituitary gland is unremarkable insitu. The brainstem and cerebellum are unremarkable. The base of the skull is without fracture. The proximal spinal cord is unremarkable.

**NECK:** The cervical vertebrae, hyoid bone, tracheal and laryngeal cartilages, strap muscles, carotid and jugular vessels, and other paratracheal soft tissues are unremarkable. The larynx, trachea, epiglottis and aryepiglottic folds are unremarkable. The upper airway is not obstructed. The tongue is unremarkable.

**BODY CAVITIES:** The organs are in their normal situs without adhesions. The subcutaneous adipose tissue is unremarkable. The parietal and peritoneal surfaces are unremarkable. The diaphragm is unremarkable. There is no free fluid in the body cavities.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: There is no excess fluid in the unremarkable pericardial sac. The pericardium is without exudate or adhesion. The heart weighs 320 grams. The epicardial surface and fat are unremarkable. The heart has a normal distribution of patent coronary arteries. The left ventricular myocardium shows no infarcts. The left ventricular wall is not hypertrophied. The endocardium, papillary muscles, chordae tendineae and four cardiac valves are unremarkable. There are no septal defects. The cardiac chambers are not dilated. The venae cavae are unremarkable. The distal main pulmonary artery contains multiple well-formed thromboemboli which completely occlude the lumen. The thromboemboli are not attached to the vessel wall. The thromboemboli extend into the right and left pulmonary arteries. The aortic arch and great vessels are unremarkable. The descending aorta shows no significant atherosclerosis. The renal and iliac vessels are unremarkable.



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RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The right lung weighs 640 grams and the left lung weighs 480 grams. The pleural surfaces show no blebs or bullae. There is subpleural hemorrhage over the lower lobes. The lungs are not hyper-inflated. The lungs show congestion. The lungs are without consolidation or neoplasm. The patent tracheobronchial tree contains no mucus or mucus plugs. The right and left pulmonary arteries contain multiple well-formed thromboemboli which completely occlude the lumens. The thromboemboli are not attached to the vessel walls. The thromboemboli are removed and collectively measure 11 cm x 3 cm x 1 cm in aggregate.

**LIVER, GALLBLADDER, PANCREAS:** The liver weighs 1880 grams and has an intact brown capsule and brown parenchyma without focal lesions. The portal vessels are unremarkable. The unremarkable gallbladder contains 5 ml of yellow bile and no stones or obstructions. The pancreas is without focal lesions.

**HEMIC AND LYMPHATIC SYSTEMS:** The spleen weighs 180 grams and has an intact purple capsule and dark red parenchyma without focal lesions. Lymph nodes are not enlarged.

**GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:** The right kidney weighs 180 grams and the left kidney weighs 180 grams. The subcapsular surfaces are smooth and unremarkable. The architecture and vasculature are unremarkable. The ureters maintain uniform caliber into an unremarkable bladder containing approximately 100 ml of clear light-yellow urine. The internal reproductive organs are unremarkable.

**ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:** The pituitary, thyroid, and adrenal glands are without focal lesions.

**DIGESTIVE SYSTEM:** The esophagus and gastroesophageal junction are unremarkable. The stomach contains approximately 50 ml of tan liquid without visible food, tablets, or pills. The gastric mucosa and wall are unremarkable. The intestines and appendix are unremarkable. The distal colon shows constipation.



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**MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:** The vertebrae, clavicles, sternum, ribs, and pelvis are unremarkable with the exception of mild scoliosis. The musculature is unremarkable. There are bilateral anterior rib fractures consistent with cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

**TOXICOLOGY:** Samples of blood and vitreous are taken at autopsy. DNA is taken at autopsy.

**HISTOLOGY:** Tissue is retained in formalin for stock. One stock jar is retained. No histology is submitted.

## **ANATOMIC DIAGNOSES:**

1. Pulmonary thromboembolus.
